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Feeder Schools

Working Together to Support Student Growth



Aligarh Modern School, Aligarh

Aligarh Modern School (AMS), managed by the Shabbir Memorial Education Society, is affiliated with the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and offers both Science and Commerce streams up to the Senior Secondary level. Since its establishment in November 1997, AMS has been committed to serving the educational needs of underprivileged students, particularly those from minority and economically weaker communities. The foundation stone of the school was laid by the late Mr. Saiyid Hamid, former Vice-Chancellor of AMU and Chancellor of Jamia Hamdard, Delhi.

Situated near the Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) campus and surrounding rural areas, AMS currently educates over 650 students from Grades 1 to 12. Many of these students are first-generation learners, and a large number receive financial support through donations to cover their school fees. Since 2011, AEEF has sponsored more than 50 students annually and has also contributed to infrastructure development through dedicated donations.

AMU Schools, Aligarh

Launched in 2021 by well-wishers and alumni of AMU School—particularly from Minto Circle is a dedicated initiative of the Student Support Group for Education (SSGE). The program is committed to supporting students enrolled in AMU-affiliated schools and ensuring that no child is forced to discontinue their education due to financial hardship.

Through scholarships, some established in honor of distinguished alumni and teachers enables deserving students to continue their academic journey with dignity and confidence. Beyond financial assistance, the initiative seeks to remove barriers to education by providing access to essential resources and fostering personal growth through structured mentorship.

This program is implemented in collaboration with the Ibn-E-Sina Academy of Medieval Medicine & Science, Aligarh.

Our Mission

To ensure that no student in AMU schools drops out due to financial constraints or lack of guidance by providing sustained scholarship and mentorship support.

Our Vision


Hamara Study Center, Roravar, Aligarh

Established on October 1, 2022

Hamara Study Center Roravar in Shahjamal, Aligarh, was founded by the Society for Human Welfare and Education to provide quality education to children in a socio-economically challenged area. Originally called "Equals School," it was renamed to reflect its commitment to inclusive, empowering education. In its initial year, the Center enrolled 211 students in Nursery, Senior Nursery, and Kindergarten, operating from a rented space with six classrooms, two toilets, and a pantry, creating a safe and supportive environment for early learning.

Today, Hamara Study Center Roravar serves 211 students from Nursery to Class III, led by a dedicated team of 08 educators and staff, mostly recruited locally to strengthen community ties. With ongoing support from the Aligarh Education Endowment Fund (AEEF) since 2023, the Center has expanded its facilities, improved infrastructure, and upheld its mission of educational excellence. Comprehensive teacher training programs further equip staff to meet students' unique needs, ensuring that vulnerable children in Roravar receive the best possible start to their education.

Hira Public School, Hanswar, Ambedkar Nagar



Hira Public School, operated by the Qaumi Refahi Society, began modestly in Hanswar with a small team of teachers and 115 students in a borrowed space. Over time, the school grew steadily, becoming a High School in 1998 and earning affiliation with the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) in July 1999. By 2006, it expanded to offer Intermediate education in the science stream, specifically designed to serve the educational needs of Hanswar and its surrounding rural and semi-urban communities.

- Today, the school educates around 2,000 boys and girls from 86 nearby villages, providing quality education from Nursery to Class 12, with a focus on science. The modern, thoughtfully planned campus features state-of-the-art facilities, fostering both academic achievement and holistic development. Spacious, well-ventilated classrooms equipped with the latest audio-visual and multimedia teaching tools create an engaging and dynamic learning environment. The peaceful, rural setting further enhances the students' physical, mental, and spiritual well-being.
- The school's efforts have empowered many girls to pursue higher education, with several advancing into teaching and medical careers. The campus includes 39 well-built classrooms, a library, laboratories, and an auditorium for students in Classes 6 to 12, although the primary section still requires improvements in classroom infrastructure.

Maulana Azad School, Delhi

Established in 2018

Maulana Azad School was established in 2018 to address a critical gap in the educational landscape—providing quality education to children with special needs and those from socially marginalized backgrounds, who are often overlooked when it comes to access and opportunities. Located in a rented facility in Abul Fazal Enclave, Jamia Nagar, New Delhi, the school currently serves 120 children across five classes, from playgroup to Grade 2. To accommodate the growing number of students, the school is actively seeking a larger rental space nearby.

The primary aim of Maulana Azad School is to create a nurturing environment where children with special needs can overcome their challenges and receive the educational, physical, and emotional support they require to integrate and thrive as equal members of society. The school is managed by Being a Woman, a non-profit organization founded in 2011, and is supported by individual donors as well as several partner organizations.

The Aligarh Education Endowment Fund (AEEF) began supporting the school in 2019, providing scholarships for students and funding key infrastructure improvements to ensure a safer and more conducive learning environment for these children.

The school's success is made possible by a dedicated team of professionals—including four special educators, a speech therapist, an occupational therapy teacher, and five assistant teachers—who are committed to empowering every child and helping them realize their full potential. Together, they strive to create a space where every child, regardless of their circumstances, can grow and succeed.



Hamara School, Mallah Ka Nagla, Aligarh


Established on 1997

It was established by a group of students from Aligarh Muslim University (AMU), Hamara School operates under the Society for Human Welfare and Education. Located in Mallah Ka Nagla, Aligarh, the school is dedicated to providing quality education to underprivileged children, particularly first-generation learners from the areas surrounding the AMU campus and nearby rural communities. Over the years, Hamara School has grown to support its students through three key programs:

- AEEF Scholarship Program
- Coaching Classes
- AEEF Food Support Program

Hamara School in Mallah Ka Nagla, Aligarh, serves 331 students from Nursery through Class V, supported by a team of 22 staff members. The school offers a nurturing environment with facilities like eight classrooms, a computer lab, a smart board, a library, and two administrative offices. Catering primarily to children from socio-economically disadvantaged families, Hamara School prepares them for transition to formal education. Since 2011, the AEEF Scholarship Program has enabled 377 students to advance to Aligarh Modern School. The school also runs a coaching program for 58 students, supported by 13 staff, and provides monthly food support to 331 students from 200 families. With 331 total enrolled students, Hamara School remains a vital educational and community resource.

Hamara Coaching & Guidance Centre

It is based at Hamara School

It has been dedicated to supporting underprivileged students academically over the past several years. The Centre provides free coaching, guidance, and counseling to approximately 100 students, helping them strengthen their academic performance and develop essential life skills.

This initiative aims to ensure that children from economically disadvantaged backgrounds have access to quality after-school education. With funding from AEEF, the Centre is expanding its resources, enhancing teaching facilities, and recruiting skilled instructors to further improve learning outcomes.

Objectives

- Provide free academic coaching to over 100 students.
- Upgrade learning resources, including textbooks, teaching aids, and digital tools.
- Conduct regular workshops on life skills, career guidance, and digital literacy.
- Administer weekly tests for students in classes V to X to prepare them for school assessments and competitive exams.

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Goals

- Deliver high-quality, free coaching for students from economically disadvantaged families.
- Improve academic performance in key subjects such as Mathematics, Science, and English.
- Introduce life skills and career development workshops to equip students for future success.

Key Achievements

Over the years, Hamara Coaching Centre has made notable progress:

- Students have successfully qualified for admission tests at institutions such as Aligarh Muslim University, Jamia Millia Islamia, and other government schools and colleges.
- Academic performance has improved, reflected in higher test scores and better school retention rates.
- Guidance and counseling programs have empowered students with communication, problem-solving, and digital skills.
- Community engagement has strengthened through regular parent-teacher meetings, fostering active participation in students' educational journeys.

Excellence in education through scholarships

Endowed Scholarships (Higher Education)

The following endowed scholarships are awarded annually on a merit-cum-means basis to deserving students, in accordance with the benefactor's wishes. While the benefactor may suggest general criteria such as academic discipline and level of study, recipients are selected through a thorough application and interview process. Scholarships are granted for one year, with the potential for renewal based on academic performance and demonstrated financial need.

Digital Literacy, Vocational Training & Employment

Empowering individuals to preparing them for employment,
self-reliance, and a better future.





Digital Literacy for School Children in Moradabad

Objectives

- Provide underserved children with access to digital tools and learning resources
- Equip government schools with essential technology
- Enhance learning outcomes through digital education

Rationale

In today's digital era, computer skills are essential for academic and professional success. Many underprivileged children, however, lack access to technology and digital learning. This initiative bridges that gap by teaching basic digital literacy—including computer use, data handling, coding, and internet skills—preparing students for future education and career opportunities.

Beneficiaries

Children aged 6–14 from marginalized communities studying in public schools or centers without digital infrastructure.

Partnership

This program is run in collaboration with ALIG Educational and Welfare Society, ensuring broader community engagement and sustainable impact.

Impact & Reach

Launched in 2022, the project currently benefits around 310 students annually and aims to expand to 2,500 students per year within five years, fostering a digitally skilled generation.



Shrin Tech Centre (Jamshedpur)

Digital Literacy for Girls

Overview

SHRIN Tech Center empowers young women to confidently navigate technology and digital tools. Through comprehensive training in word processing, data management, coding, and internet use, the program not only builds digital literacy but also strengthens critical thinking and problem-solving skills. It prepares participants for careers in technology, information systems, and other fields where digital competence is essential. This project is sponsored by Madraswala family.

Beneficiaries

The center serves girls aged 18 to 30 from underserved communities, particularly those with limited access to digital education. It provides a safe, supportive environment where participants can acquire essential tech skills, gain confidence, and develop the foundation for professional growth.

Partnership

This program is run in collaboration with ALIG Educational and Welfare Society, ensuring broader community engagement and sustainable impact.

Impact & Reach

Since its launch in 2022, SHRIN Tech Center has trained approximately 120 girls annually, with plans to expand to 500 girls per year within the next five years.

Costs

- Initial setup: \$4,000–5,000
- Recurring annual expenses: ~\$5,000 (covering equipment maintenance, instructor salaries, internet, and curriculum updates)

Long-Term Goals

Over the next decade, the center aims to train 1,500 young women, with over half already securing meaningful employment upon program completion. By fostering digital literacy and career readiness, SHRIN Tech Center contributes to gender equity and community development in today's digital era.

Objective

The Tarraqi SMART Centre (TSC), an initiative of Tarraqi I Foundation based in Daryaganj, Old Delhi, is a vocational training and employment-focused program dedicated to empowering underprivileged youth through skill development and sustainable livelihood opportunities. The Centre works closely with marginalized communities to enhance employability and create pathways toward stable careers.

Training Programs

TSC offers industry-relevant courses designed to prepare students for real-world professional environments, including:

- Digital Marketing
- Customer Relationship & Sales
- Spoken English
- Basic IT
- Workplace Readiness



AEEF Support

In 2025, AEEF contributed US\$ 12,000 to support essential operational expenses, including rent, staff salaries, and overall centre management—ensuring uninterrupted training and employment support for hundreds of underprivileged youth.

Long-Term Impact & Geographic Reach

Taraqqi I Foundation (www.tif.org.in) is a registered non-profit trust with 12A/80G & FCRA certification working with respected & renowned partners since December 2012 across India. Focusing on education, skills development, employment & entrepreneurship. It continues to strengthen access to free or affordable qualitative education & economic independence among marginalized communities. Currently operating actively in:

Skills And Trade Development Training of Underprivileged Ladies

Overview

HUNAR GHAR empowers women from underprivileged communities by equipping them with professional skills for employment or entrepreneurship in the garment industry. Recognizing women as key drivers of community development, the center combines technical training with personal growth initiatives to enhance productivity, confidence, and leadership.

Intended Beneficiaries

The program primarily serves underprivileged women who face challenges generating household income. It also targets unskilled female laborers working in applique designing, tailoring, or boutique work, who often receive unfair wages due to limited skills, financial literacy, or confidence.



Training Offered

- Skills Training: Transforming unskilled laborers into skilled professionals through advanced stitching, embroidery, applique designing, and handicrafts, enabling access to better-paying jobs.
- Occupational Training: Sewing-focused programs that create a foundation for livelihoods as tailors or garment professionals.
- Career and Technical Education (CTE): Functional literacy and technical instruction for illiterate women.
- Trade Schooling: Training in manual trades, marketing, and business fundamentals for economic empowerment.
- Apprenticeship: On-the-job training for women to apply acquired skills and gain professional experience.
- Technical Education: Industrial and mechanical skills training, including digital marketing literacy, to expand career opportunities.

Partnership

This program is run in collaboration with ALIG Educational and Welfare Society, ensuring broader community engagement and sustainable impact.

Impact & Costs

Since its launch in November 2024, HUNAR GHAR has trained over 60 unskilled women and provided livelihood opportunities to 20 beneficiaries. The program currently targets around 120 women for various training sessions and aims to expand to over 300 women in the coming years based on community needs identified through surveys.

The center operates with an annual capital and operational budget of approximately \$5,000. HUNAR GHAR plays a vital role in fostering economic empowerment, financial independence, and sustainable development through vocational training in clothing repair, customization, and trade skills. By transforming unskilled and marginalized women—including widows and school dropouts—into skilled tailors, designers, and entrepreneurs, the center creates lasting social and economic impact.

Hunar Ghar, Lucknow

Women's Garment Stitching Vocational Training Center

Overview

HUNAR GHAR empowers women from underprivileged communities by equipping them with professional skills for employment or entrepreneurship in the garment industry. Recognizing women as catalysts for community development, the center emphasizes both technical training and personal growth, enhancing productivity, confidence, and leadership.

Intended Beneficiaries

The program primarily serves women from marginalized backgrounds—including homemakers, single mothers, and widows—who seek financial independence but have limited access to education or job opportunities.

Training Offered

Courses include basic and advanced tailoring and embroidery, complemented by personality development sessions designed to strengthen confidence, communication, and leadership skills.

Partnership

This program is run in collaboration with ALIG Educational and Welfare Society, ensuring broader community engagement and sustainable impact.

Impact & Costs

Since its launch in 2023, HUNAR GHAR has trained over 200 women and currently supports around 100 women daily, with plans to expand to 300 beneficiaries per year.

The program was established with an initial investment of approximately \$10,000, and annual recurring expenses of about \$5,000 cover trainers' salaries, materials, maintenance, and certification support.



Mahila Training Markaz in Aligarh

Established in 2000

It established by the Shabbir Memorial Education Society under the management of Aligarh Modern School, Mahila Training Markaz is dedicated to empowering young women and girls from underprivileged communities. Situated in a densely populated, low-income area, the center began with a modest grant from a well-wisher, initially offering basic tailoring skills to promote economic independence.

In its early years, the program operated with just one instructor and a supervisor, limiting its reach due to financial constraints. Since 2011, support from the Aligarh Education Endowment Fund (AEEF) has revitalized the center—enabling facility expansion, enhanced staff salaries, and the introduction of a literacy program alongside vocational training.

Today, approximately 15 girls and young women aged 12 to 18 are enrolled. Some are acquiring basic literacy skills, while others with prior education are preparing for the High School Examination for Women conducted by Aligarh Muslim University.

By combining education with skill development, Mahila Training Markaz continues to create meaningful opportunities for women, fostering self-reliance, confidence, and long-term empowerment.

We are proud to collaborate with our sister organizations including SSGSA to support a merit-based scholarship program for academically outstanding Master's students in the Faculties of Science, Life Science, Medicine, and Engineering at Aligarh Muslim University. This initiative enables bright, deserving individuals to pursue advanced education and secure admission to prestigious Ph.D. programs around the globe.

Through this program, students receive not only financial assistance but also invaluable mentorship by being connected with experts in their respective fields. The scholarship covers essential expenses, including GRE/GMAT, TOEFL/IELTS, and application fees for up to five universities in western countries. Since 2011, AEEF has sponsored 36 students, many of whom have successfully gained admission to leading Master's and Ph.D. programs in Western universities.

By opening doors to higher education, this initiative helps students realize their full potential, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to make a lasting impact in their fields and beyond.



